God's work in Ethiopia that you continue to faithfully support through your encouragement, prayers and financial donations, continues to thrive.

Much has happened since we last reported on the Koshe and Woja villages. For the first time ever, ACTS held a "graduation" ceremony for those who are leaving our schools to go on to the government schools. In addition to the children involved, their parents and local governmental administration officials attended the celebration. This event served to strengthen our ties to the communities in which we work and to build a broader awareness and sense of trust. We have found that the trust factor is a key in what we do as the opportunity to share the Gospel increases with the level of trust that is achieved. 1 Peter 2:9-12 says "*They may, by your good works which they observe, glorify God in the day of visitation*".

The children returned to school in September after a wetter than normal monsoon season (corresponding with our summer months). With subsequent time off to celebrate the Ethiopian New Year and another week away for a national holiday, October has brought a return to normalcy to the school facilities. Only now are we able to determine who is back at school and how many new attendees have enrolled on our program. At the end of the month Karen and Bill Cornell will be traveling back to Ethiopia to visit the schools. Included in their agenda of things to accomplish are meeting with and training the new ACTS Ethiopia administrator, Tesefy, having formal sit down meetings with the local administrators of both villages, contracting for the building of the shintebet (latrine) for the Woja school, helping to reallocate the sponsorship/current student roles, and, of course, spending time with the 400 kids now at school and with many of the older kids who have gone on from ACTS' program to the government schools. In addition, the groundwork will be laid for taking a larger team back to visit in the early spring when much new curriculum will be introduced to the teachers and students. As always, your prayers for safe travel, good health, successful interactions and, most importantly, continued growth of God's Kingdom, will be appreciated.

The backbone of our support continues to come from Trinity Community Church of Clovis and its church family, but ACTS has been somewhat successful in reaching out to other individuals for additional support. Work is being done to identify a village in another unreached people group, in which to build a third school. This will require a major influx of both capital and willing sponsors. Any help that you can give in identifying a direction in which to look would be greatly appreciated. We continue to rely on you to be our foot soldiers, the champions of the ACTS ministry. We are confident that your efforts in this regard will be pleasing to God. Ephesians 2:10, *"For we are God's workmanship, created in Jesus Christ to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do"*.
